1	King Hussein Cancer Foundation	It is a Jordanian non-profit foundation established in 2001. It serves as the supporting body for the King Hussein Cancer Center in Amman and works to support specialized medical services at the Center, promote cancer awareness and early detection, and provide psychological and social support to patients and their families.	Jordan	Purchase of a colonoscope for screening and imaging the colon	The project aims to provide and upgrade the necessary medical devices and equipment through the purchase, installation, and operation of advanced medical equipment in the targeted departments. The requested device is part of the colon screening and imaging program, which provides advanced diagnostic and therapeutic services for patients with colon diseases. Based on a field visit to the Foundation in February 2017 to assess its activities and the impact of ISF's assistance on the ground, a donation of US\$ 50,000 was made for the purchase of an ambulance, which had a positive impact in transporting emergency cases, reaching up to 312 cases annually, as well as supporting blood donation campaigns. In addition, ISF's contribution of US\$ 100,000 had a positive impact on the treatment of Syrian refugee children in Jordan suffering from cancer.	150,000	50,000	50,000	50,000

2	The Qur'anic Language Waqf at King Abdulaziz University	<p>The Waqf aims to teach the Arabic language to non-native speakers both inside KSA and abroad, providing educational programs for non-Arabic speakers, developing their language skills, and supporting applied scientific research activities that serve the Arabic language and address related challenges and solutions.</p> <p>It is the first Waqf at the Arab and Islamic levels specialized in supporting programs and initiatives for teaching the Arabic language, both to native and non-native speakers. The Waqf operates under regulations of the General Authority of Awqaf and functions under the umbrella and supervision of King Abdulaziz University. According to the Waqf bylaws, the rector of K. Abdulaziz University chairs its Board of Trustees. The Waqf is honorarily chaired by Prince Khalid Al-Faisal, Advisor to the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques and Governor of Makkah Region.</p>	KSA	Contributing as co-donor and founder of the Quranic Language Waqf at King Abdulaziz University	<p>This project is of special importance since the Islamic Solidarity Fund of the OIC is to take part as co-donor and founder of the Waqf, given the alignment of objectives and goals in promoting Qur'anic language teaching to qualify non-Arabic-speaking Muslims both inside and outside the Kingdom. It also strengthens partnership between ISF and King Abdulaziz University in supporting Arabic language projects through strategic and professional programs of high quality and financial sustainability.</p>	0	200,000	200,000	200,000

1	Harran University	<p>Harran University is a public Turkish university located in the city of Şanlıurfa in southeastern Türkiye. It was established in 1992 and comprises several faculties, including medicine, engineering, sciences, economics, and arts.</p> <p>The project is submitted upon the recommendation of the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Türkiye to the OIC.</p>	Turkey	Recovery of Şanlıurfa STEM Center (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Center)	<p>The project aims to rehabilitate the University's STEM Center, as part of the post-earthquake recovery program. Şanlıurfa is one of the provinces most affected by the recent earthquakes in Türkiye. The Center has not undergone any maintenance or renovation since the disaster, which has significantly restricted its capacity to provide secure and effective educational services. Therefore, rehabilitation has become an urgent necessity to ensure safe and functional conditions for students and educators.</p>	0	95,000	95,000	95,000

2	Solidarity Charity Society	<p>It is a non-profit charitable society established in 2004, aiming to promote Arabic language education, religious and cultural education, and to provide assistance to those in need within Thai society. The society is officially licensed by the relevant government authorities in Thailand.</p> <p>Twenty-seven years ago, ISF provided funding for the construction of the Society's headquarters. ISF's support continued by granting assistance to the construction of classrooms to expand Dar Al-Maaref School and the Holy Qur'an Memorization Institute. These contributions have had a significant impact in strengthening the role of Muslims in southern Thailand and have provided educational opportunities for a larger number of male and female Muslim students from both northern and southern Thailand.</p>	Thailand	Construction of a Female Students' Dormitory at Dar Al-Maaref School in Satun town	<p>This project aims to accommodate female students from the northern mountainous areas of Thailand by providing them with suitable housing, instead of having them reside in the school mosque. It offers an opportunity for students seeking knowledge, particularly Muslim girls from northern Thailand.</p> <p>ISF's previous contributions to the Society were focused on the education sector through Dar Al-Maaref School, which was established in 1950 in an area predominantly inhabited by Buddhists. These contributions have brought about a tangible positive impact, reflected in improved community balance between Muslims and Buddhists, and have strengthened the role of the Society in promoting the principles of Islam and Islamic Sharia.</p> <p>ISF has provided several forms of assistance, most recently the inauguration of the Aisha Building (may Allah be pleased with her) in 2024, which includes a number of classrooms.</p>	285,000	60,000	60,000	60,000
